Student Safety Reminders

We need to provide a reminder that teachers are on yard duty at 8:45am-9:00am and from 3:30 until 3.45pm in the afternoons. Anytime children are at school outside of those hours, they are not supervised unless by a parent or carer. Parents needing to drop off or pick up children outside of those hours are encouraged to use the outside of schools hours care service.

Yesterday our teachers provided a reminder to all students regarding safety when walking to and from school, with a particular focus on stranger danger. It is important for children that these conversations happen regularly both at school and home. Some points that you may like to reiterate with your child may be;

- -Explain that strangers are people they don't know, and they should never go anywhere with a stranger or accept anything from them
- -Say no to strangers and remind them not to accept anything from strangers
- -Stay aware of your surroundings and avoid distractions like phones
- -Walk with siblings or friends whenever possible
- -No, Go, Yell, Tell: Teach children to say "no," go away from the situation, yell loudly, and tell a trusted adult.

Parents parking in the staff car park

A reminder to parents/carers that there is no access/use of the staff car park between 8am and 4.00pm each day with the exception of the disabled car park. This includes foot traffic. For safety reasons, children and their parents are required to walk on designated footpaths and not through the staff car park.

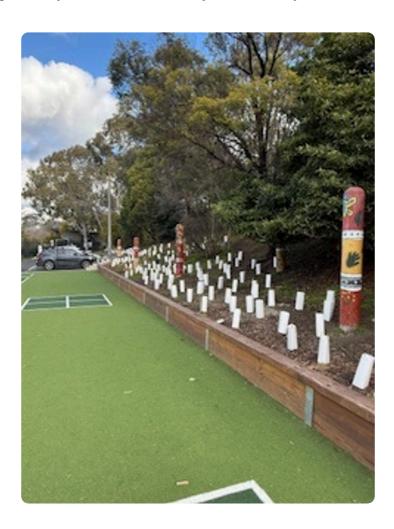

It's full of helpful hints and tips to help your whole family eat well, drink well and clean well – for life.

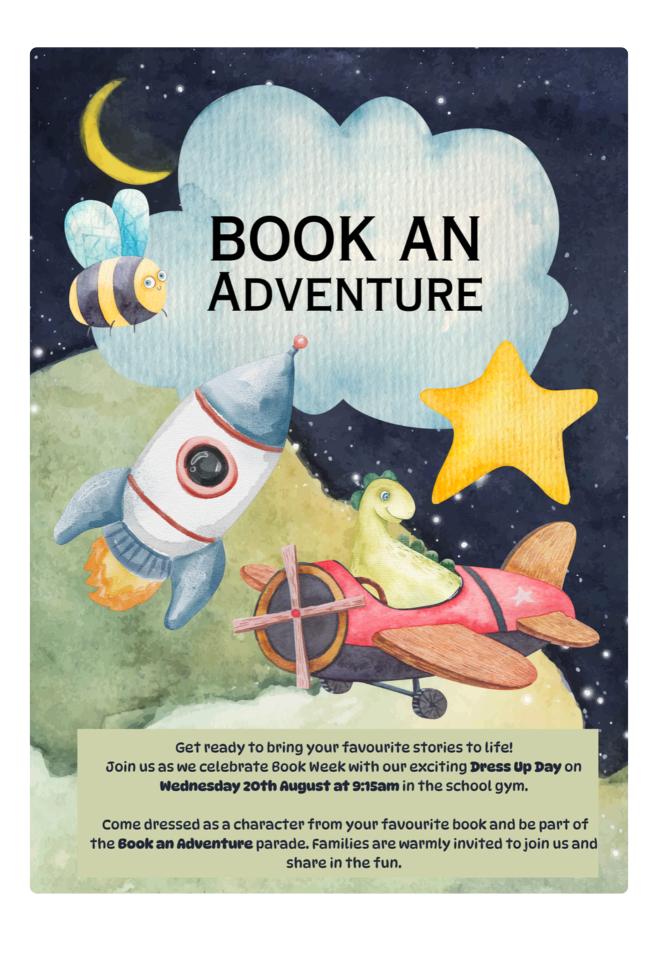
Standard strength toothpaste

Smile Squad provides standard strength fluoride toothpaste that is generally used by ages six and over, unless recommended by a dental or trained health professional. If your child is under six, please talk to a dental or trained health professional to find out if your child might benefit from using this toothpaste. You can also choose to put the toothpaste away until they turn six or give it to someone else in your family to use.

Do I need to attend my child's appointment?

No, you do not need to attend your child's appointment. You can attend if you would like to, and you can take your child to the community dental clinic if you prefer.

The purpose of the Student Dress Code is to outline Banyule Primary School's requirements for student dress and appearance and to provide information about uniform purchase and support, dress code implementation and

This dress code has been developed by Banyule Primary School's School Council in consultation with our school community to ensure that it respects the rights of individual students whilst reflecting the values and interests of

The Student Dress Code aims to:

- foster a sense of community and belonging and encourages students to develop pride in their appearance
- support Banyule Primary School's commitment to ensuring that our students feel equal and are dressed safely and appropriately for school activities.
- · reduce student competition on the basis of clothing.
- enhance the profile and identity of the school and its students within the wider community.

The School Council has developed a dress code that we believe provides a range of choices for students and is cost effective for families.

Students are expected to comply with this Student Dress Code while traveling to and from school, during school hours and when attending school activities.

Our uniform items and appearance requirements meet human rights and anti-discrimination requirements as well as health and safety considerations

Dress codes with gender specific requirements are not mandated at Banyule Primary School and options are given to all students irrespective of their gender.

At Banyule cultural or religious headwear can be included as part of the ordinary school uniform. For an example of the inclusion of headwear in the list of uniform items, see Appendix A.

The full list of Banyule Primary School's compulsory school uniform items are available at Appendix A to this policy.

General appearance
While at school, travelling to or from school or participating in school activities, Banyule Primary School students must comply with the following:

- Uniforms must be clean and in good repair
- Uniforms must be clearly marked with the owner's name
- Additional layers of clothing may be worn underneath the uniform for added warmth, provided these undergarments are completely hidden.

Sorting Friendship Fires®

Friendship Fires® can be big or small! Is it a tiny spark or is it a raging bushfire? Help your child put their conflict into perspective.

Key Outcome

Your child will practise putting their conflicts in perspective.

Objective

Sometimes, children feel a little out of control in their friendships and their worries and bad feelings start to feel much bigger than they actually are. This can get in the way of their ability to put out a Friendship Fire®. If they allow their worries to build and grow, sometimes their messy feelings can take over and blow Friendship Fires® way out of proportion. They might start to imagine that their Friendship Fires® are much bigger and harder to fix than they really are.

Thinking this way is called **catastrophizing** and it can be really unhelpful and keeps children

and teens stuck in their negative emotions. Perspective-taking is an important skill to keep

Friendship Fires® and other big emotions in check. We want kids to get in the habit of asking

themselves, "How big is this Friendship Fire really??"

Practicing realistic thinking helps manage Friendship Fires® more effectively. Keeping

things in proportion, where the reaction matches the situation, helps kids take a deep

breath, keep a clear mind, and problem-solve...like a Friendship Ninja!

There are many different types of Friendship Fires® that all range in strength... From a tiny

spark, to a puff of smoke, to a smoldering pile of ash, to a camp fire, a bonfire, or even a

raging bush or forest fire!

If you can realistically name the size of your problem and sort out what type of Friendship

Fire® it is that you are having, you will know how to manage it more effectively too!

This activity will give you some practice at sorting Friendship Fires® according to their size,

ferocity (which means how fierce or strong they are), and put them into perspective. See if

you can rank the Friendship Fires in the handout (found in Materials) from biggest to

smallest.

Parents, start off by sharing an example with your child of something that you believe would

create a small Friendship Fire® versus something that might create a huge Friendship Fire®.

What do you do to try to try keep things in perspective when you can feel a Friendship Fire

starting to spark?

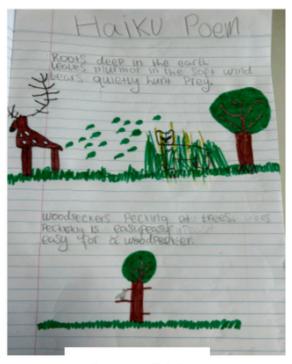

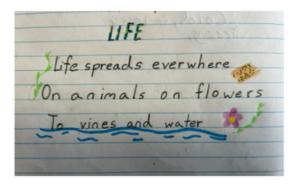

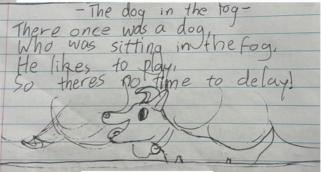

P-2 TERM 3 Newsletter

STEAM with Mrs Nedelkos

This term in STEAM, the Prep, Year 1 and Year 2 students will explore the topic 'Inspirational Figures in STEAM'. Students will investigate a different STEAM hero each week and will complete activities based on each of these people. Our inspirational figures are; Rube Goldberg, Annie Easley, Florence Nightingale, Amelia Earhart, Frida Kahlo, Fibonacci and Jane Goodall. The term will be filled with hands-on problem solving tasks to enable students to build their understanding of each of the 5 areas of STEAM.

PERFORMING ARTS with Miss Blacker

During Term 3, Prep students will explore Dance and its various elements. They will develop an understanding of movement through sequenced dance steps and learn to move safely. Students will be introduced to a variety of folk dances, such as Heel and Toe Polka which they will learn and rehearse.

In Term 3, the Year 1 students will make their own finger puppets and focus on bringing their characters to life using the elements of drama. They will develop their drama skills by retelling well-known fairy tales. Year 2 students will explore percussion instruments and bring a scripted Dreamtime story to life using movement and expressive drama techniques. Each student will take on a role, collaborating and rehearsing to prepare for a performance in front of an audience. Afterward, they will reflect on their experience and use drama vocabulary to provide thoughtful feedback to their peers.

LOTE with Fang Lǎoshī

This term in LOTE, Prep and Year 1 students will explore the topic "Fruits." Prep students will begin to recognise the importance of tone in Chinese and observe how sounds can be represented using familiar letters in Pinyin. They will use gestures, songs, and actions to help memorise vocabulary and sentence structures, and practise answering simple questions like "I like + fruit." Year 1 students will continue using gestures and actions to reinforce vocabulary, and begin forming short phrases such as "I like to eat...," don't like to eat...," and "I have..." in Chinese, with growing independence. A range of games, music, and hands-on art activities will support their language learning and classroom communication. Year 2 students will be focusing on the theme "Feelings and Emotions." They will learn to express a range of basic emotions in Chinese using simple vocabulary and sentence structures. Through engaging activities such as songs, games, role-plays, and actions, students will develop their ability to recognise and use phrases like "I am happy," "I am sad," and "I am tired" in Chinese. In addition, they will be introduced to commonly used Chinese characters related to the topic and will be encouraged to practise reading and writing them during classwork.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION with Mrs Christofis

In Term 3, our Prep students will continue to develop their

Fundamental Movement Skills through structured instruction, focusing on correct technique. The key skills we will focus on include: leaping, jumping, catching, kicking and skipping with a rope. In Health, students will continue to explore the concepts of healthy and unhealthy choices, with a focus on healthy eating habits. Additionally, we'll discuss the importance of sleep and introduce basic knowledge about parts of the human body. During Term 3, the Year 1 students will continue to revisit the Fundamental Movement Skills they were taught in Prep, focusing on improving their accuracy and technique. The skills that they will be focusing on will be rolling, bouncing, kicking, catching, overarm throwing and skipping with a rope. In Health, students will continue to explore their strengths and challenges, navigating their feelings and emotions using different strategies and understand a healthy balanced meal. In Term 3, The Year 2 students will continue to consolidate the skills learnt in previous years, with a particular focus on rolling, bouncing, kicking, catching, overarm throwing, side on front arm and forehand striking and skipping with a rope. They will get the opportunity to work with a gymnastics coach for a 2 week clinic in the middle of the term. In Health, the Year 2's will continue to explore the human body, focusing on our organs and their function. They will continue to identify

their strengths and challenges and build strategies to assist

them in navigating different emotions.

3-6 TERM 2 Newsletter

VISUAL ARTS with Ms Rawlinson

This term in Visual Arts, students will explore the theme "Literature in Visual Arts", making rich connections between storytelling and artistic expression. Using the CBCA Book Week Shortlisted texts as inspiration, students will respond creatively to selected books through their covers, themes, and illustrations. Through drawing, painting, collage and mixed media, students will analyse visual storytelling elements and develop artworks that reflect their personal interpretations of the stories. This unit celebrates the power of books and art coming together to spark imagination and meaning.

PERFORMING ARTS with Miss Daniel

This term in Performing Arts Year 3 and 4 students will 3/4: During term 3, Year 3 and 4 students will explore the elements of drama to communicate intentions through well-known fairy tales and discuss how ideas and situations are developed. They will study either traditional or fractured fairy tales and begin to understand how a scripted story can be twisted to make the plot more interesting and amusing.

Students will plan and rehearse scripted fairy tales in small groups, and present their work to their class. They will evaluate their own learning and progress while being encouraged to provide feedback on their peers' performances.

5/6: During term 3, Year 5 and 6 students will focus on singing and dancing while incorporating performance elements into musical numbers.

Students will develop their knowledge of dance. They will experiment with the Elements of Dance through choreography and performance tasks. Students will learn melodies of songs and learn choreography while working towards performing with confidence and expression. They will be encouraged to reflect on their learning, including future goal setting. Students will evaluate a cultural dance and discuss the Elements of Dance they observe.

LOTE with Xu Lǎoshī

This term, Year 3 and 4 students will review how to say numbers 1-100 and will be introduced to bigger numbers up to 1000. They will apply the skill to describe prices and conduct conversations about shopping for food.

Year 5 and 6 students will explore the topic of 'Time and daily routine'. They will create a clock and practise saying time in Chinese. Students will also learn to describe their daily routine and complete a comic story to talk about what they do every day.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION with Mr Nedelkos

During Term 3 in P.E the Years 3-6 students will learn a variety of different ball sports. All sports will be run over 3 weeks with the first week looking at all the different skills of the game and getting the students to practise the skills individually, or in smaller groups. During week 2 the students will revisit the skills and apply them into small games. During week 3 the students practise playing the game format with their peers. Their aim is to utilise their skills as well as their offensive and defensive abilities to help their team.

The Year 3's will be focussing on the following sports: basketball, cricket and hockey.

The Year 4's will be focussing on netball, hockey and tee ball.

The Year 5's will be focussing on cricket blast, football and basketball.

The Year 6's will be focussing on badminton, basketball and football.
